IN THE WORD

24 And let us be concerned about one another in order to promote love and good works, 25 not staying away from our worship meetings, as some habitually do, but encouraging each other, and all the more as you see the day drawing near.

Hebrews 10:24-25 (HCSB)

Fellowship, an area that many Christians may neglect without realizing the significance. In the early church it seems clear that the practice of gathering was both common and healthy (**Acts 2:44-47**). They would come together not one day a week but everyday. They met not only in one location such as the Temple but also in each others homes and even more beautiful was that they held all things in common. The early church didn't consist of denominations, it consisted of those who were faithful followers on Jesus. The early church met not only for their own needs but with the desire to meet the needs of others. How beautiful it would be if the church would follow that example today. Unlike the early church it seems today that many can't make the time to gather with other believers and worship the Lord. For some not meeting with other believers whether in a church or a home is because they don't see that the church is offering them anything. That is people look for churches with the mindset of "what can this church do for me?" This however is a poor method for choosing a group to fellowship with because the church is first and foremost is to serve God, not the other way around. We gather to worship and serve the Lord. We gather because we desire to study and grown in the Word of God. We gather because we sometimes need encouragement and other times need correction. It is easy for us to get busy and get out of fellowship with the Lord and with other believers and when we do it often has a bigger effect on us than we realize. If you have been neglecting gathering with others I encourage you to get plugged in somewhere. I think you will be glad you did.
