IN THE WORD

8 For if Joshua had given them rest, God would not have spoken later about another day. 9 Therefore, a Sabbath rest remains for God's people. 10 For the person who has entered His rest has rested from his own works, just as God did from His. 11 Let us then make every effort to enter that rest, so that no one will fall into the same pattern of disobedience. Hebrews 4:8-11

Rest. The one thing most people need more of. We need rest of course because we are exhausted. Mentally, physically, and emotionally. We are always on the go. Whether it is work, family, or church, there is always something going on. Thanks to technology like cell phones and the invention of things like Facebook it seems that there is never any escape. Most of this however we bring on ourselves. We have become such a slave to our phones that we are to afraid to put them down because what if someone should need us. Therefore we never fully rest, but rather are always waiting subconsciously for that call to come in, that message to pop up, or that email to hit the inbox, never allowing for any real escape. Some of you reading this may be longing for rest, but where does it come from? Hebrews 4 references Joshua leading the Israelites into the promised land. While it was freedom and rest for them after being freed from Egypt and wandering in the wilderness for 40 years, not all of the Israelites made it, some because of their disobedience missed entering the land of rest. That however was not the ultimate rest the Bible speaks of. Real rest doesn't come when you complete the job you are on or make it to your vacation destination. There is rest in those things, but the rest Hebrews is speaking of is rest in Jesus. Hebrews call us to enter *His* rest. True rest doesn't come from a week off, it comes from being fully content with Jesus. When we are trusting Jesus fully, we are content with everything else and that gives us a spirit of peace and rest that transcends understanding and when we have trusted Jesus as our Lord and Savior we long for a day of eternal rest. Let us not be like those in Joshua's day who because of their sins missed God's rest. Let us be those who through Jesus Christ receive forgiveness of our sins and enter God's rest eternally.
